

What To Do During an ICE Encounter

- **DO NOT OPEN THE DOOR** if an immigration agent is knocking. If you are inside your home, show this card through a window or slide it under the door.
- **ASK IF YOU ARE FREE TO LEAVE.** If the agent says yes, calmly walk away.
- **DO NOT ANSWER QUESTIONS.** You have the right to remain silent. You do not have to discuss your immigration status, where you were born, or how you entered the country.
- **DO NOT SIGN ANYTHING** without first speaking to a lawyer.
- **YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO REFUSE A SEARCH.** You do not have to consent to a search of your home or belongings.
- **YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO RECORD** your interaction as long as you do not interfere.
If agents force entry, do not resist. Tell everyone inside to remain silent. If you have valid immigration documents, you should show them.

Statement To Present to the Agent

- I do not wish to speak with you, answer your questions, or sign or hand you any documents based on my Fifth Amendment rights under the United States Constitution.
- I do not give you permission to enter my home based on my Fourth Amendment rights under the United States Constitution unless you have a warrant signed by a judge or magistrate with my name on it that you slide under the door.
- I do not give you permission to search my belongings based on my Fourth Amendment rights.
- I choose to exercise my constitutional rights
